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## DATA SHARING

As of July 1, 2018, all manuscripts submitted to ICMJE member journals (NEJM, JAMA, etc.) that report the results of clinical trials must contain a data sharing statement

- Whether individual de-identified participant data will be shared
- What data in particular will be shared
- Whether related documents (study protocol, statistical analysis plan) will be available
- When the data will become available and for how long
- By what access criteria data will be shared

Will you have a similar data sharing statement for your journal? What do you think will be the biggest challenges to implement this new policy? Does your journal have any requirements regarding Data Monitoring Committee (DMC) members being employees of the study sponsor?

## DELIVERING IMPORTANT RESEARCH FASTER

Some journals claim that they will publish a peer-reviewed manuscript within four weeks of receipt “for research papers... judged to warrant fast dissemination”.

- Do you think the research that you publish is reaching clinicians fast enough?
